Emphasize that a footprint consists of information that you post, as well as information that others post. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Celebrity #1 = Demonstrate the footprint of an individual with a negative online presence, identifying elements that reflect poorly on the individual (i.e., legal issues, partying, questionable language, unflattering photos or video, etc.)</li> <li>▪ Celebrity #2 = Demonstrate the footprint of an individual with a positive online presence, identifying the elements of the post that reflect favorably on the individual (i.e., achievements, milestones, affiliations with respected organizations, etc.)</li> </ul> </li> </ul> </li> <li>2.
